Of particular interest to seniors who are planning to take at least one gap year between college and medical school:

- *Mock interviews: schedule yours before you graduate!

- *Assistance with finding a gap year position (scribing, research, other possibilities): meet with Don Snyder in the fall of senior year; start actively looking for a position by Christmas break if you're planning to graduate in May
